About the Medical Research Future Fund (MRFF)

The MRFF is established under legislation (MRFF Act 2015) with the objective:

"to improve the health and wellbeing of Australians"

\$6.3 billion over 10 years

\$650 million per annum

21 initiatives

\$\$\$

\$20 billion in capital base came from health system savings; expectation that research would provide returns to the public by improving care and outcomes (currently at \$22 billion)

Key features of the MRFF

Rapid and flexible disbursements to capitalise on our health and medical research strengths to respond to emerging issues (<u>flexible/responsive</u>)


Focuses on an area of unmet need or a technology with transformational potential (priority led)

Brings together key researchers, health professionals, consumers, stakeholders, industry partners (outcome focused)

Harnesses resources across the system, supporting the growth of health and medical research and boosting Australia's economy (collaboration, expertise investment)

Uses innovative research approaches (<u>new grant models</u>), not standard peer-review





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MRFF – Missions



- **Dementia, Ageing and Aged Care** supports research that will enable older Australians to:
 - maintain their health and quality of life as they age
 - live independently for longer
 - access quality care when they need it
- 2024 Dementia, Ageing and Aged Care Grant Opportunity is currently open for application till 7 August 2024
- \$19m available for research grants of up to \$3m, aligned with two priority areas (health and medical researcher capacity and capability and priority populations).
- Indigenous Health Research Fund supports Indigenous-led research to tackle health issues experienced by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. It aims to:
 - improve health outcomes and
 - close the gap on health mortality and morbidity of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
- 2024 Indigenous Health Research Grant Opportunity is currently open for application till 24 July 2024
- \$13.4m available for research grants of up to \$5m, aligned with two priority areas (Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health and Preventative and Public Health Research).






Rapid Applied Research Translation (RART) Initiative

- Supporting transformative translational research, so patients can benefit from better quality of care.
- RART was evaluated in 2020, findings helped with development of the 2020 RART grant opportunity
- **2020 RART** closed in 2021 and funded 9 projects (\$62 m), including \$24.6m towards grants in the rural stream
- 2022 RART closed in 2023 and funded 9 grants (\$36.2m) two streams focussed on implementation of substantial improvements to health care and/or health system effectiveness, and one on evaluation of 2022 and 2020 RART projects


- Strengthened focus on consumer involvement and priority populations
- Revised assessment criteria (40% project impact, 40% project methodology, 30% capacity, capability and resources to deliver the project, overall value and risk (unweighted))
- **Competitive** (rather than targeted) funding, with grant applications open for longer **(4-6 months)** where possible
- Grant Opportunity Forecast Calendar <u>MRFF grant opportunities calendar | Australian Government</u> <u>Department of Health and Aged Care</u>
- Increasing stakeholder engagement and communication activities
 - MRFF CEO webinars, MRFF RAO webinars, topic-specific webinars, fortnightly newsletter
 - Implemented 'State Leads' at Director level Primary contact for stakeholders in that state/territory
 - Engaging with Research Administration Officers on post-award management or active grants
- Continue to publish evaluation reports
 - Review of the Million Minds Mental Health Research Mission 2021-22
 - Evaluation of the MRFF Clinical Trials Activity 2021-2023
 - Review of the MRFF Australian Brain Cancer Mission 2021-2023



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MRFF Report on Funding for Rural, Regional and Remote Health Research (August 2023)

- MRFF investment into RRR focused projects has increased since inception
- A rural focus has been embedded in a number of grant opportunities (through streams and eligibility criteria)
- Increased funds have been awarded to projects that are undertaken in rural areas, and to projects that address health topics of significance to rural areas of Australia



- a The total for 2019 includes the 2019 Rural, Regional and Remote Clinical Trial Enabling Infrastructure grant opportunity (\$124.4 million awarded).
- b The dataset for 2022 is not yet complete and does not include data for grant opportunities that opened in 2022 and for which outcomes are not yet available or have not been announced.
- c The number of projects funded includes grants with payments that commenced before or on 30 December 2022.

MRFF Report on Gender Data for Grant Opportunities (August 2023)

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
Overall MRFF funded rates for women and men are similar, for both leading Chief Investigators (20.3% for women and 21.5% for men) and all Chief Investigators (25.7% for women and 25.7% for men)
